2010 RULES

A. PROGRAM

This program is a co-sponsorship between Ohio Technical College and the ASA-Educational Series. The purpose of the program is to involve young ladies and men that are currently in high school in the auto racing industry and reward them with scholarships to Ohio Technical College based upon their performance.

High School students may apply for the program through their contacts with Ohio Technical College. Applications will be forwarded to the ASA-Educational Series for evaluation. Students that are accepted will become ASA-Educational Series Members.

The accepted students will be assigned to a specific ASA race team competing at an ASA Member Track. They will earn points based on their performance with the race team during the race season.

In most areas, the race season will be from March through September. This program will run from the start of the program through July of each year for Senior students. Undergraduates shall continue the program through the full season.

Points earned will be awarded on an annual basis and shall be accumulated for all consecutive seasons in which the student participates through the Senior year.

Seniors will be awarded scholarships based on the points earned. The awards will be made after graduation from high school, normally on approximately August 1st.

B. POINTS SYSTEM

1. Students shall earn the same number of race points that their team driver earns at each scheduled race at the ASA Member Track when the student is working as a crew member during that race. No points shall be earned if the student is not working as a crew member during the race.
2. Students shall earn 10 points per hour worked on the car as a crew member excluding during races. These will be primarily earned for work in the team shop and during practice days.
3. Senior students shall earn up to 100 points for the season ending essay required. These essays will be graded on content, spelling, grammar and presentation.
4. Students shall earn up to 100 points on their logbooks based on content, spelling, grammar and presentation.
5. There must be 4 students assigned to a Division in order for them to receive points.

Students will be issued a log book to keep track of their performance factors and time worked. This log book will be submitted to the ASA-Educational Series office at the end of the season or other date as required. Points will be calculated and approved by the Director of the Student Educational Series. They will then be provided to Ohio Technical College for approving senior scholarships and accumulation of points for undergraduates.

C. SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

1. The ASA Member Track Manager shall award a \$20,000 Founders Award Scholarship to the Senior level student with the highest overall points total at his track.
2. The remainder of the scholarships shall be awarded by Division at the ASA Member Track. For each Division, each season, points will be awarded towards scholarships in the amount of:

1 st Place	\$10,000
2 nd Place	\$7,500
3 rd Place	\$5,000
All Others	\$2,500

These scholarship points are accumulative for the consecutive seasons worked. If a student drops out of the program before the completion of his Senior year, all points are forfeited.

The maximum scholarship award will be \$20,000 and points over the required for this level scholarship will be dropped.

D. STUDENT QUALIFICATIONS AND INFORMATION

Students must be 14 years of age or older. They must be currently enrolled in an accredited High School. They must become a crew member or driver member of ASA-ES/OTC Educational Series each calendar year they are involved.

Students shall apply for the program with OTC recommendation by contacting the ASA-Educational Series Office. They will have to complete an application form, provide a resume of the students background, provide a letter of recommendation from an OTC representative or school teacher, and provide funds for the annual ASA Membership fee of \$200.

E. STUDENT INSURANCE PROGRAM

Students will be covered by the ASA Member Track's Liability Insurance while at the track. They will be covered by the ASA Member secondary participant accident insurance while at the track working.

ASA insurance covers the students while working at the track only; it does not insure the students at team shops or anywhere else off site.

F. TRACK MANAGERS ROLE

The track manager shall assist in assigning students to Divisions and teams in the Divisions. He will also be involved in working with the students in any way needed while they are at his track.

The ASA Member Track shall provide a season long complimentary pit pass to all ASA-ES students assigned at his track.

ASA-Educational Series Office approves, registers students and keeps track of the points earned..

ASA Member Track assigns the students to Divisions and Teams. The member track provides the students with a season pit pass at no charge. All member tracks shall provide a link on their web site to the ASA Educational Series Web Site. They will also require teams involved in the ASA Educational Series to put the series decals on the race cars.

Each track should have a person that acts as a facilitator in this program. That person can be the OTC Rep or someone else. The job of the facilitator is to assist in assigning the students to Divisions and Teams, working with the students to make sure that they are active in the program and assisting in assuring that the log books are correct.
